
# Conversations

This is where Larry Gagosian opened his first LA gallery and Basquiat painted through the night below street level. Where David Hockney exhibited formative works. Where Hal Ashby screened rough cuts and Randy Newman wrote the score for *The Natural*.

This Summer 2022, NeueHouse Venice Beach opens its doors, a home for the exchange of new ideas, connections, and culture.

In 1973, a Hollywood actor turned movie producer named *Tony Bill*, fresh off his Oscar-winning film *The Sting*, purchased 73 Market. He turned the building into a haven for artists, writers, filmmakers, and creators of all kinds to come together to work on their creative endeavors, collide, inspire and learn from each other. For decades, this street has served as a home base and inspiration for the creative industries, and **NeueHouse Venice Beach** continues this tradition.





# 73 Market Street

### THE GAS HOUSE

The indisputable LA home of the Beats for a three year period, where countercultural figures like Ken Kesey and Jack Kerouac met, fought, played chess, listened to jazz, and drank coffee, before it was finally shuttered by police as a "public nuisance."







An inventor of the movement now known as Land Art, Heizer showed his first monumental boulders at the original ACE/Gallery on Market Street.



In 1983, the 21-year-old phenom decamped from New York and took up residence in Larry Gagosian's below ground living quarters on Market Street. Working from late afternoon to morning, Basquiat painted prolifically in preparation for crucial shows at Gagosian, including iconic works made from materials scavenged from the street.

### RANDY NEWMAN & THE NATURAL

During post-production for 1984's smash hit *The Natural*, Randy Newman holed up at 73 Market Street to compose the score. Tony Bill recounts hearing the music floating up through the floor, and Newman taking breaks to ask him what for his thoughts of the work going on down below.









Native Angeleno Larry Gagosian bought a vacant lot on Market in the late 70s, where he proceeded to build his first LA Gallery (and living quarters), courtesy of the visionary local architect Robert Mangurian.

### LIGHT AND SPACE ARTISTS

In the late 60s and early 70s, a new artistic movement took shape in the Market Street studios of artists Robert Irwin and Larry Bell–one that used only the raw materials (light & space) for which Venice is famous to create groundbreaking new works of art.







### 72 MARKET ST OVSTER BAR

Opened by Tony Bill and actor Dudley Moore in 1983, 72 Market Street became a beachside destination for visiting Hollywood royalty, beloved for its laid back atmosphere and feel good food, as well as its in-house radio show and lecture series with pre-eminent literary figures.







### LA LOUVER GALLERV

In 1978, a young David Hockney exhibited some of his earliest prints at L.A. Louver exhibition, where he continues to exhibit to this day.





VENICE, CA 90291







For at least 80 years, someone has been saying that Venice Beach was in danger of losing its soul, its creative spirit.

The Beats brought anarchic energy in the 1950s. Then came the hippies and Bohemians. The neighborhood became an artists' enclave, and still, in every decade since, people have feared that outsiders would snuff out Venice's creative soul. Hollywood discovered it. Tech took over. But through each era, there has been one constant: Venice's spark. People come here seeking a different way of life: a little further from the city and closer to the beach, among others like-minded creative people. Venice Beach attracts all types, a community united in its pursuit of a life set apart.

What Venice Beach has been missing up to now is a place for this community to come together, where different creative communities and pursuits can collide and coalesce.

NeueHouse Venice Beach was conceived for this purpose. A place where creative minds flow seamlessly from work to play and back again. A place to gather around ideas, culture, exceptional food and drinks.

We can think of no more fitting place for NeueHouse to be.


